Overview: Types of Local Anti-Immigrant Ordinances

Type	Description	Number of Towns/Status
Housing Only	<ul style="list-style-type: none">1) Limits the number of individuals (who are not related) that may live together2) Fines landlords who rent to undocumented individuals<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Some of these ordinances now require all renting residents to register a "renter's permit" to certify resident status	<ul style="list-style-type: none">1) Passed: 52) Pending: 3 ; Failed: 3
Employment Only	<ul style="list-style-type: none">1) Fines businesses that employ undocumented immigrants<ul style="list-style-type: none">a) some ordinances carry fines, others don't; still others may restrict business licensesb) as a way to appease local businesses, many ordinances provide no enforcement mechanism; others encourage local residents to report infringements to local enforcers2) Another form revokes the contracts of any city contractors that employ undocumented immigrants<ul style="list-style-type: none">a) some ordinances make contractors sign a form saying that they don't employ undocumented workersb) other ordinances call for contractors to provide the paperwork of their employees3) Requires those who hire off-site day laborers to register with the city, display a certificate in their car windows, and present written terms of employment to workers4) Requires employers to verify the documentation of workers using the Basic Pilot Program: "The Basic Pilot program is a voluntary Internet-based program that was created to allow employers to electronically verify workers' employment eligibility with the U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security (DHS) and the Social Security Administration (SSA)."	<ul style="list-style-type: none">1) Passed: 1; Pending: 1; Failed: 42) Passed: 4; Pending: 3; Failed: 13) Passed: 1; Pending: 14) Pending: 1



Type	Description	Number of Towns/Status
English Only	Establishes English as the official language of all government departments. This ordinance is often passed simply as an anti-immigrant measure, a tool of intimidation, as well as a sign that immigrants are not welcome.	Passed: 9; Failed: 2
MIX – H and EM	Ordinances that include both employment and housing provisions	Passed: 5; Pending: 3; Failed 2 (includes Riverside and Hazelton who took out their English-only ordinance and put it into a separate ordinance to make the IIRA appear "not racist")
MIX – H and EM and En	Ordinances mix all three major types -- a.k.a. Illegal Immigration Relief Act (IIRA)	Passed: 5; Pending 7; Failed: 6
