Peace No War National Peace & Justice Caravan Project 2005-2006

This is a multi-year project to organize community education campaigns to teach peace, anti-war messages to the communities we don't usually approach, such as: American rural area, southern states, the "red" states, bible belt, link global and local issues, to organize community events to help recruit new people to the peace and justice movements. Offering them training, tools and skills so they can outreach to their own local communities to influence their opinions on key U.S. domestic and international policies for the years to come.

Major goals of this campaign

- Create basic, simple messages to advertise our policies. Using arts, film showing and community forum as medium, to educate and recruit people who are not familiar to the issues, to our side.
- Offer tools, experiences and network opportunities to help local peace activists to build their new local movements.
- Think Globally, Act Locally: link anti-war/peace movements to local community issues, such as: immigrant workers rights, health care, jobs, education, police brutality, counter-recruitments, and so on.
- Opportunity to recruit veterans and their families to join our movement, offering tools and skills to create their own local anti-war, counter-recruitment campaigns.
